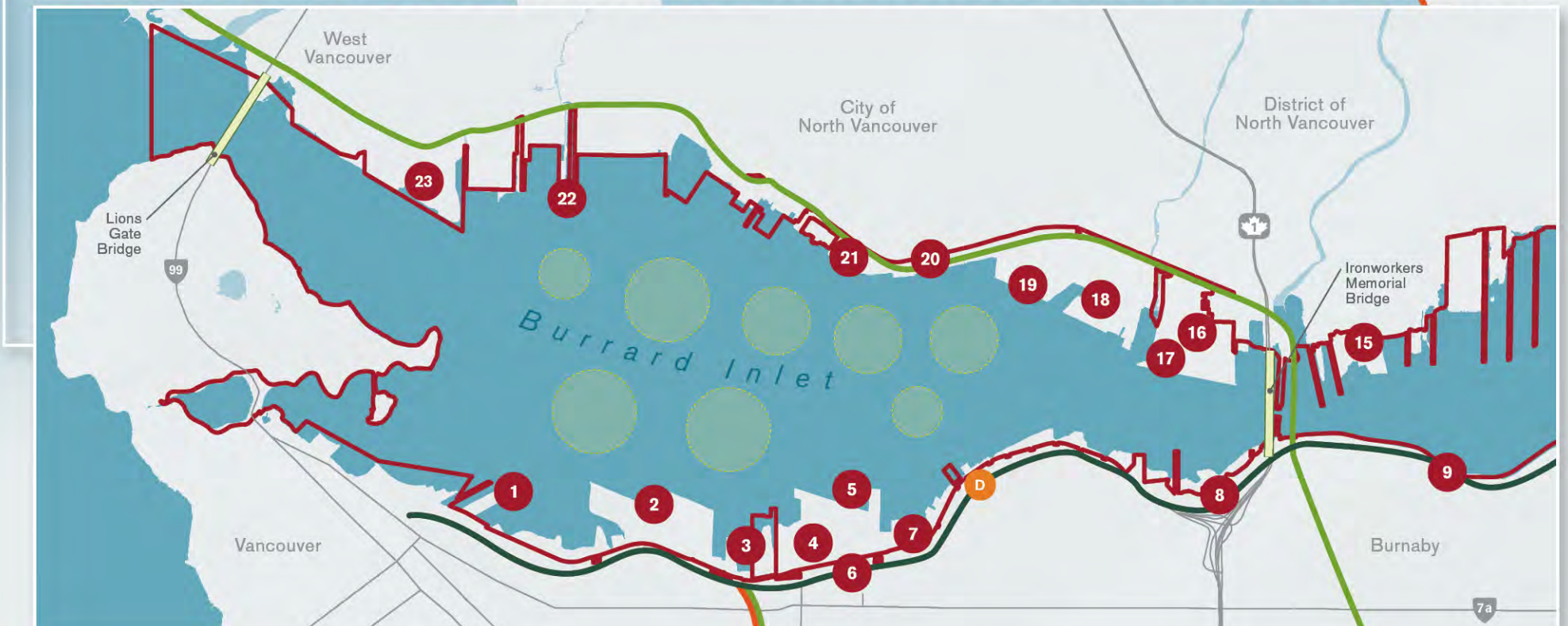
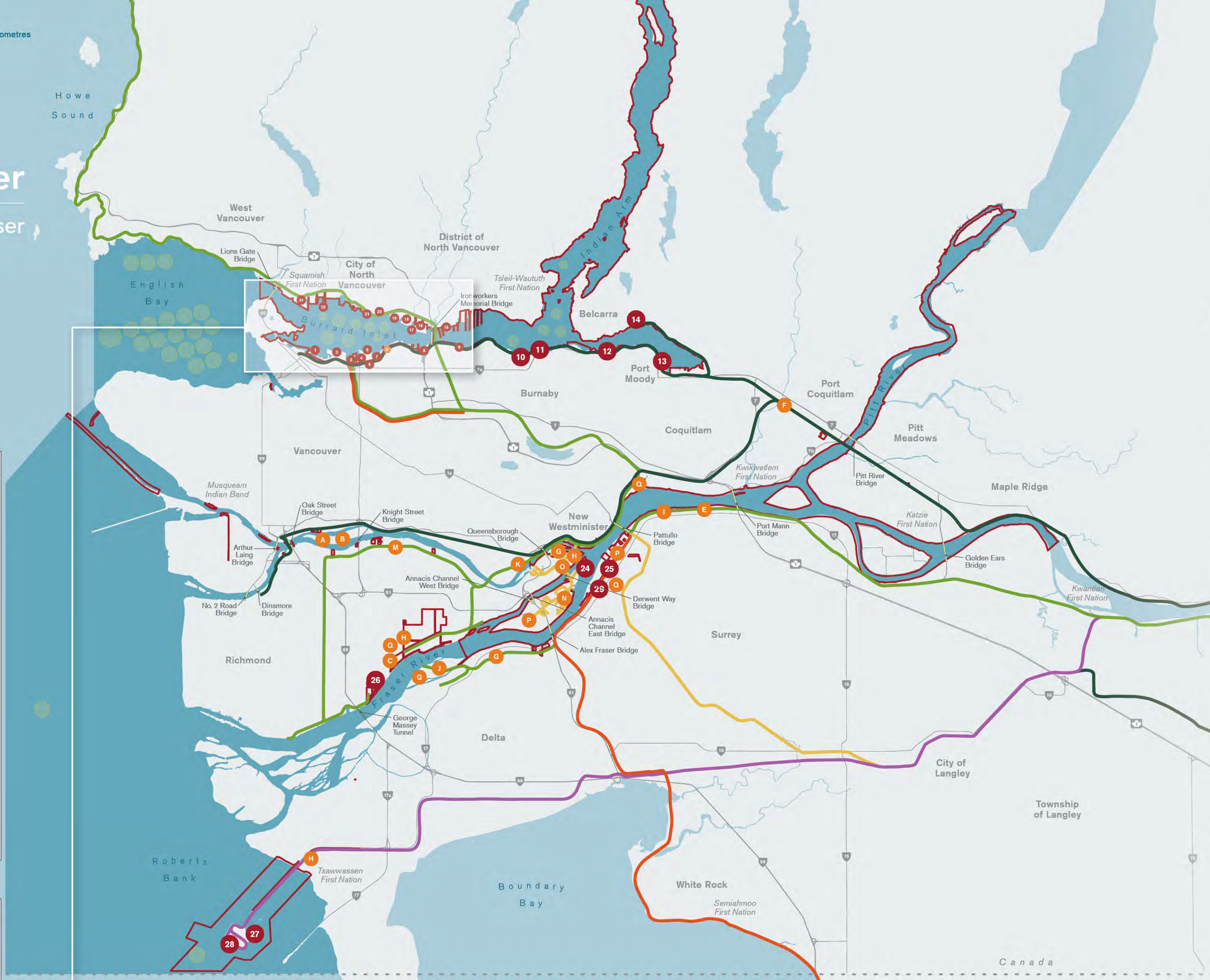

Port terminals

1 Canada Place
Cruise ship terminal
Operator: SSA Marine (under contract with the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority)
Community: Vancouver
Additional fact: Homeport for the Vancouver-Alaska cruise itinerary. Canada Place is a multi-use facility with three berths, two of which are shore power enabled, and is home to the port authority offices.

2 Centerm
Cargo type: Container
Operator: DP World Vancouver
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Container and containerized cargo
Additional fact: Centerm is a two-berth container terminal and is shore power enabled.

3 Lantic Inc.
Cargo type: Bulk
Operator: Lantic Inc.
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Bulk raw cane sugar imports and other sugar products
Additional fact: Lantic Inc. refines raw sugar into various sugar products, which it then distributes across Western Canada.

4 Alliance Grain Terminal
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: Alliance Grain Terminal Ltd.
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Cereal grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Alliance Grain Terminal is one of the oldest grain terminals at the Port of Vancouver.

5 Vanterm
Cargo type: Container
Operator: GCT Canada Ltd. Partnership
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Container and containerized cargo
Additional fact: Vanterm is the sister terminal to Deltaport.

6 West Coast Reduction
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: West Coast Reduction Ltd.
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Rendered animal fats and waxes, agriculture products, plant-based oils, and biodiesel
Additional fact: West Coast Reduction renders animal byproducts for export, and also exports canola oil, biodiesel, and other petroleum products.

7 Pacific Elevators
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: Viterra Inc.
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Oilseeds, cereal grains, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Pacific Elevators was built in 1915 and was one of the original grain elevators at the Port of Vancouver.

8 Cascadia
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: Cascadia Port Management Corp.
Community: Vancouver
Cargo: Cereal grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Cascadia is owned by Viterra and Richardson International.

9 Parkland Terminal
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: Parkland Refining (BC) Limited
Community: Burnaby
Cargo: Petroleum products
Additional fact: The Parkland Terminal is the only active petroleum refinery in the Lower Mainland.

10 Shellburn Terminal
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: Shell Canada Ltd.
Community: Burnaby
Cargo: Petroleum products
Additional fact: Shellburn Terminal is a petroleum storage and distribution terminal.

11 Westridge Marine Terminal
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: Trans Mountain Corporation
Community: Burnaby
Cargo: Crude petroleum and petroleum products
Additional fact: Westridge Marine Terminal handles petroleum products.

12 Suncor Energy - Burrard Products Terminal
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: Suncor Energy
Community: Port Moody
Cargo: Petroleum products
Additional fact: Burrard Products Terminal is a storage and distribution facility for petroleum products, located on the south shore of Burrard Inlet.

13 Pacific Coast Terminals
Cargo type: Liquid and dry bulk
Operator: Pacific Coast Terminals Co. Ltd.
Community: Port Moody
Cargo: Sulphur, potash, canola oil, and ethylene glycol
Additional fact: Pacific Coast Terminals is a diversified bulk terminal at the Port of Vancouver.

14 IOCO Terminal
Cargo type: Liquid and dry bulk
Operator: Imperial Oil Ltd.
Community: Port Moody
Cargo: Fuel oils, lubricants, and petroleum products
Additional fact: IOCO Terminal began operations in 1915. It handles heavy and intermediate fuel oil and marine gas oil.

15 Chemtrade Chemicals
Cargo type: Liquid and dry bulk
Operator: Chemtrade Electrochem Inc.
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Bulk sea salt, caustic soda, and sodium chlorate
Additional fact: Chemtrade Chemicals is a producer of bleaching products for the pulp and paper industries.

16 Univar Canada
Cargo type: Liquid bulk
Operator: Univar Canada
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Caustic soda solution, ethylene glycol, and petroleum products
Additional fact: Univar is a distributor of chemical and related products and services in Canada.

17 Lynnterm
Cargo type: Breakbulk and project cargo
Operator: SSA Marine
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Forest products, steel, machinery, and project cargo
Additional fact: Lynnterm is a consolidation centre for Western Canadian exports and a receiving centre for steel products.

18 G3 Terminal Vancouver
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: G3 Canada Ltd.
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: G3 Terminal is one of the most advanced and efficient grain terminals in North America.

19 Neptune Bulk Terminals
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: Neptune Bulk Terminals (Canada) Ltd.
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Metallurgical coal and potash
Additional fact: Neptune Bulk Terminals is a state-of-the-art vessel loading facility for coal and potash, and unloading facility for phosphate rock.

20 Cargill Terminal

Operator: Cargill Canada
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Cereal grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Cargill Terminal services include loading of grains, oilseeds, and other agricultural products.

21 Richardson International
Cargo type: Dry bulk
Operator: Richardson International Ltd.
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Cereal grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Richardson International terminal was established in 1926.

22 Fibreco
Cargo type: Liquid and dry bulk
Operator: Fibreco Export Inc.
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Wood pellets and agri-products
Additional fact: Fibreco provides terminal services to AGT Food and Ingredients for agriculture products and Drax Group for wood pellets.

23 Vancouver Wharves
Cargo type: Liquid and dry bulk
Operator: PKM Canada Marine Terminal LP
Community: North Vancouver
Cargo: Sulphur, mineral concentrates, diesel, biodiesel, and grain products
Additional fact: Vancouver Wharves handles more than four million tonnes of dry bulk cargo and more than four million barrels of liquids annually.

24 Annacis Auto Terminal

Operator: Wallenius Wilhelmsen Solutions (WWS) Vehicle Services Canada Ltd.
Community: Delta
Cargo: Automobiles and machinery
Additional fact: Annacis Auto Terminal is undergoing a terminal optimization project in 2023.

25 DP World Fraser Surrey
Cargo type: Container, bulk, and breakbulk
Operator: DP World Fraser Surrey
Community: Surrey
Cargo: Containers, agri-products, steel, machinery, and project cargo
Additional fact: DP World Fraser Surrey is a multi-purpose facility located on the Fraser River.

Operator: Wallenius Wilhelmsen Solutions (WWS) Vehicle Services Canada Ltd.
Community: Richmond
Cargo: Automobiles
Additional fact: Richmond Auto Terminal processes imported automobiles from Asia.

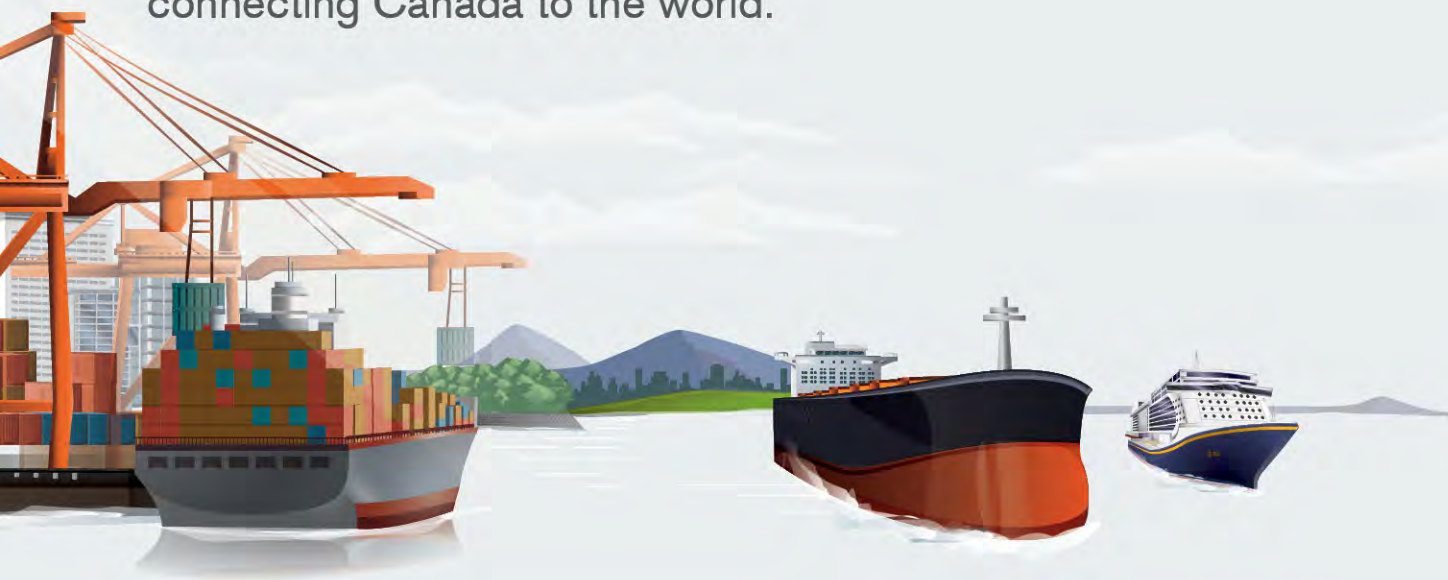

Community: Delta
Cargo: Container and containerized cargo
Additional fact: Deltaport is Canada's largest container terminal and is shore power enabled.

28 Westshore Terminals

Operator: Westshore Terminals Limited Partnership
Community: Delta
Cargo: Metallurgical and thermal coal
Additional fact: Westshore Terminals is Canada's largest coal terminal, and expansion is currently underway to facilitate the loading of potash exports.

Operator: Farish and Heimbecker, Limited, and GrainsConnect Canada Operations Inc.
Community: Surrey
Cargo: Grains, oilseeds, and specialty crops
Additional fact: Fraser Grain Terminal is the only grain terminal situated on the Fraser River.

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority is an arm's-length federal agency responsible for the shared stewardship of the lands and waters that make up the Port of Vancouver, Canada's largest port.

Our mandate, as outlined in the *Canada Marine Act*, is to enable Canada's trade objectives on behalf of all Canadians, ensuring goods are moved safely through the Port of Vancouver, while protecting the environment and considering local communities.

Our Operations Centre is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, monitoring port lands and waters, and ensuring compliance with regulations and procedures mandated by the *Canada Marine Act*.
