PROJECT UPDATE AND HOLIDAY WORK HOURS

Overview

As you may know, Metro Vancouver is currently constructing a new outfall at the Annacis Island Wastewater Treatment Plant to carry treated wastewater to the Fraser River. This project is one of several upgrades Metro Vancouver is undertaking that will allow the plant to meet the needs of our growing population, strengthen its ability to operate in the event of an earthquake, adapt to climate change, and ensure the continued protection of public health and the environment.

The new outfall is expected to be in service by mid-2023; construction for the overall project is expected to be complete by fall 2024.

Construction Activities

The following activities are upcoming or ongoing as we construct the new outfall:

- Continuing vibratory pile driving in the Fraser River
- Tunneling between the treatment plant and the new outfall
- Installing two diffuser manifold arms in the Fraser River

What to Expect during Construction

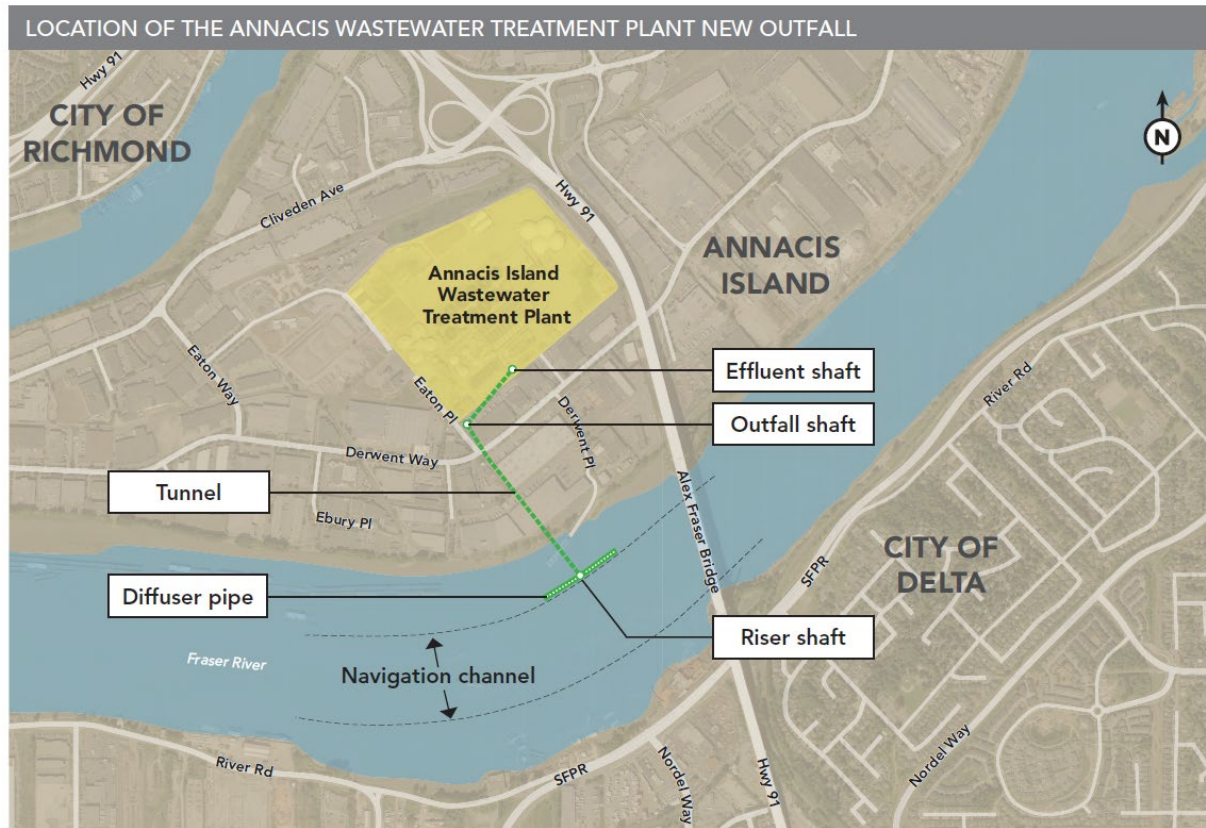
Metro Vancouver is committed to minimizing construction impacts whenever possible. However, we recognize this construction may impact you and your community. Impacts from this work may include:

- Construction noise from heavy machinery and vehicles in the area
- Temporary vibrations near the work area

Staying on Schedule during the Holidays

With the holiday season upon us, construction crews are working hard to complete this essential project. To maintain our project schedule, crews will continue working throughout December. Typical hours of work are Monday to Friday between 7:00 am and 7:00 pm, and Saturdays between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm. Construction activities that will not have a significant impact on surrounding communities will continue 24 hours a day, seven days a week, as needed, until spring 2023 in order to complete work efficiently.

All work will comply with the City of Delta and Vancouver Fraser Port Authority bylaws and granted bylaw variances. Please understand, river conditions and flow rates may impact the work schedule.
